Dear Partners of MINTS Seminary In-Prison,

The following pages in this booklet are letters written by our brothers behind bars expressing their gratitude for your support of my ministry with MINTS Seminary In-Prison. As an evangelist and seminary professor with MINTS it is my mission to bring the light of the gospel to one of the darkest corners of our world – prisons. As the inmates will tell you in their letters, life in prison is a living hell. It is a place of loneliness, hostility and chaos. A place where men are stripped of their dignity, where kindness is looked upon as weakness, and where evil is glorified.

It is in this grim environment that the Lord has called me to share the love and mercy of God through Jesus Christ. As you read their letters you will discover how the gospel has transformed these once violent criminals into passionate disciples of Jesus who are now walking in grace. While serving their sentence, they are now serving Jesus by sharing the gospel with their fellow inmates and showing acts of kindness in a cruel, thankless and selfish environment. As a result of their witness to Jesus, a gospel movement is growing behind these prison walls. The chaplains and wardens at both prisons where I teach have witnessed the gospel-transformation in the inmates and expressed their support and gratitude for the ministry of MINTS Seminary In-Prison.

The prophet Isaiah wrote, “*The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is on me, because the Lord has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness the prisoners*” (Isaiah 61:1-3). Because of your support of this ministry, I have witnessed the words of Isaiah at work in the lives of these men. Whenever I perform *The Gospel of Mark* or teach a seminary class to the inmates, I get to watch prisoners being released from the darkness that surrounds them and brought into the glorious light of Jesus Christ. Many of the letters that you read in this booklet will attest to the transforming power of the gospel in the lives of these inmates.

Upon completing their degree with MINTS and serving their time in prison, many of my students want to return to their communities and serve as pastors, evangelists, youth ministers, chaplains, and urban missionaries. Instead of returning to a life of crime, like most prisoners when released, these men will be living a life for Christ! A wonderful testimony to the power of the gospel!

As you read these letters, I would kindly ask that you take a moment to pray for each inmate. Ask God to bless his study of Scripture, both during class and in his cell. Pray that the Lord gives him the confidence and compassion to share the gospel with fellow inmates in both word and deed. I would also ask that you would pray for me and my ministry to these inmates. Pray that the Lord would open the eyes of my heart to His grace and truth as I study the Scriptures and prepare each class. Please pray that as I travel performing *The Gospel of Mark* in prisons that the Lord would open the hearts of those who don’t know of the Father’s love. Lastly, please pray that I would receive the necessary funds to carry on this mission of bringing the Good News of Jesus Christ to our brothers behind bars.

I PRAY THAT THESE THOUGHTS REACHES YOU IN A SEASON WHEN; GOODNESS, MERCY, UNDERSTANDING, FAITHFULNESS, FORGIVENESS, AND LOVE ARE YOUR COMPANIONS.

As for myself, my well being is based upon the task at hand, which is to get you to support Rev. Coppolo's prison ministry with MINTS. If I am able to do this, I can truthfully say I am doing great, while waiting on the Lord's promises.

If I am not able to get you to support Rev. Coppolo's prison ministry I am depressed.

It would be a miscarriage of justice if I didn't pause here to give you a brief bio. I am 63 years old and has been in prison for forty-two years, which makes me a perfect candidate to articulate why you should support Rev. Coppolo's prison ministry.

PLEASE NOTE, if you have NEVER KNOWN the pressure of being an underdog, if you have NEVER MADE bad decisions, if you have NEVER FELT SHAME, if you have NEVER KNOWN the struggles that are ASSOCIATED with NEEDING TO FORGIVE YOURSELF, but NOT KNOWING HOW. You might as well disregard this letter.

But if you have ENCOUNTERED ANY of the above issues PLEASE SUPPORT REV. COPPOLA'S MINISTRY.

The guys here at Everlydes are young, old, and middle age. Some are fathers, grandfathers, uncles, brothers, nephews, sons, and step sons. They are whites, blacks, Jews, Spanish, Chinese, and Italians.

Some of us are guilty, some are not. Regardless of OUR STATUS there is ONE commonality that bond all of US. Being that WE ARE IN PRISON we have been tattooed with stigmas and stereotypes to such a degree that some of our own family members want to SUPPORT US.

Rev. Coppolo, is not deterred by the portraits that been depicted of US. He is a willingly vessel of the Lord. Which blessed him with the ability to see us through the eyes of Jesus.

The moment he starts to teach the class. We dare to ponder, "Maybe there is hope. Maybe God has forgiven us. Maybe we can learn to forgive ourselves. Maybe we can once again be stars in our dreams, instead of getting killed in our nightmares."

If truth be told I have been blessed to ENCOUNTERED this man of God ONE time. That was Monday 6-13-22. Unfortunate, I had missed the first two classes. I ASKED Rev. Coppolo if I could make up for the lessons I missed and be apart of the class. He didn't exchange words with me, he simply said yes. At once tears emerged within me, which surprised me for prior to that ENCOUNTERED I had cried so much that I thought I had cried out. I thought I would need a cry transfusion. I was WRONG!

I just finishing praying for you to support the man of God. SO if you discern our heavily Father pulling at your heart, mind, and soul. Please dont rebel. Instead, do His will.

Dear MINTS Seminary In Prison Supporters,

Greetings in the name of our Lord & Savior Jesus Christ!

I feel the need to write you and thank you very much for supporting Rev. Coppola's prison ministry with MINTS.

I would like to explain to you just how important MINTS courses are to me.

As of today, I've been incarcerated 39 years 8 months and 11 days, lost all my family. Dad, Mom, and four brothers, I then lost all hope and really didn't care about living, I was deep in the prison lifestyle.

In 2004, I who "trying" to be a Christian, going through all the motions, without connect structure, it doesn't work. I kept fighting against God, but "HE" never gave up on me when "HE" should have.

In 2018 I attended Kairos, honestly, I went for the freedom food, and to my surprise "God" was there awaiting me. Even though I met God my relation with "HIM" was rocky because of my lifestyle during this time.

I needed God in my life, although I needed something or someone to help in this journey. I couldn't do it alone, I wanted to know God, I had to transform, although transformation is a process. It takes faith and patience to see the results that bring out the true nature of "Christ" in any of us.

The MINTS courses mean so much to me I now stay focused and grounded as I have never before. It's amazing to me how we students would see one another on the recreation yard and discuss "God", (the book of Mark) & find this to be at peace with my fellow inmates, never would these conversations take place were it not for Rev Coppola and MINTS.

I know and fully understand that thinking should be an active process that, when cultivated, can change a persons behavior, circumstances and ultimately, his fate.

My interest in spiritual things (MINTS) came from a need to reach out at my most powerless point and tap into a higher power, something beyond me, and at the same time, within me. I long for a sense of wholeness that I had never known but sensed I was entitled to. I set out to learn more about my spiritual self and I began exploring the bible while doing MINTS courses with other inmates some nights in the cellblock.

In MINTS I want to be able to encourage others to trust "God" with their lives and world. I like to be able to do full time service to "God" in some capacity, my life is living proof that "God" can and will use anyone surrendered to him.

Rev.Coppola gave a awesome performance (by himself) of the gospel of Mark, I'm aware that Rev.Coppola is aware that the greatest place to preach/minister isn't in big churches with swelling crowds and lofty recognitions. The greatest place to preach is in the trenches, in the fox holes and the happenings of life. Rev.Coppola has a greatful audience because he has taken the message "to a messy place and scrapes the hog hairs off the prodigal sons of "God", who are locked away in the -body pens by the spiritual elite.

I have learned because of Rev. Coppolo's teaching, MINTS the gospel of Mark that "God" mightly uses some of the most wretched sinners whom he converted into great ministers. It is because these characters were people who were accustomed to passion and acquisition. They were people who although misdirected at one time, possessed such a burning passion that, if bridled and directed, could make them people of great accomplishment.

As closing,

It is a striking blow to my limited comprehension of "God" to accept that "HE" would use the most unorthodox procedures and inhospitable environments to develop me into something teeming with the potential for dynamic growth through the MINTS courses as well as Rev. Coppolo ministering to the inmates here at Everglades Correctional institution.

During my 22 years in prison I've completed several faith based programs and Bible studies. Even so, recently the Spirit moved me to do more but I was not sure what that would be. Then, in late May of this year I was blessed with the opportunity to see Rev. Coppola's performance of the Gospel of Mark. Although I've read the book of Mark several times, Rev. Coppola's performance brought this Gospel to life. I was so inspired that I enrolled in his MINTS class so that I could study the book of Mark.

This class has offered an oasis of peace in the otherwise hostile environment of Dade CI. The homework requires several hours to complete. I carry my class composition notebook and Bible with me when I go to other programs so that I can study between activities. Years ago I earned an undergraduate degree and a masters degree. This course requires every bit as much thought and preparation as did classes for those degrees. Now, while I'm studying Mark, I'm transported to another time and place

When I do return to my cell after class I'm relaxed mentally and physically. I'm better prepared to face the daily challenges of prison life and to share God's love with others, both fellow prisoners and staff. I will complete my sentence in a few months and it is my intention to continue my MINTS studies through online classes. I don't know if I will ever earn a degree but I do know that these studies bring me closer to Jesus. I now see that my mission field is wherever I am, knowing that God is with me through the grace of Jesus and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

I thank God for Rev. Coppola's prison ministry with MINTS and for your continued support. Praying for God's blessing for you.

MY MAIN FOCUS WILL BE THE PREVENTION OF YOUTH & TEENAGE GANG PARTICIPATION, I PLAN TO USE MY EXPERIENCE, KNOWLEDGE AND INFLUENCE WITHIN MY COMMUNITY WHICH WILL ALLOW ME THE CHANCE TO ENCOURAGE YOUNG BOYS & GIRLS TO COMPLETE SCHOOL AND NOT GIVE INTO PEER-PRESSURE OR ANY LEVEL. MY GOAL IS TO CHANGE THE MINDSET OF KIDS AND TEENS GROWING UP IN DISFUNCTIONAL AND ABUSED HOUSEHOLD. I BELIEVE THAT MY CHANGE WILL INFLUENCE MANY OTHERS WHO KNOW AND KNEW THE OLD ME WILL BE MOTIVATED TO VIEW LIFE ON A DIFFERENT PLANE. Dear MINTS Seminary In-Prison Supporters:

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your generous support of Reverend Coppolo's prison ministry with MINTS.

Your generosity offers me the availability of courses to pursue my MA degree. Without your support I would never be able to afford this pursuit. In prison it is imperative for an individual to focus on the Kingdom of God and never let his eye wander. Contrary to what you may believe the prison system is a cesspool of depravity, violence, and lawlessness. It is a filthy, disgusting moral vacuum where self help, character building and hope must be self generated.

In taking Reverend Coppolo's course on the Gospel of Mark it gives me the time to fully immerse myself in the inspired word of God. His vast theological knowledge allows him to open thought provoking and potentially life changing discussions during class. The well ordered homework allows each student to spend an additional 3 hours weekly per class attended immersed in the Bible.

I have been in prison for thirty years. I am serving a life sentence for a murder I am a former career law enforcement officer. I was a Homicide Supervisor (Sergeant) with the then named Metro Dade Police Department here in Miami. At the same time I was employed in law enforcement I was also a commissioned member of the Army reserve.

Because of the generosity of people such as yourselves I earned both an AA and BA degree in Biblical studies while at another prison. Now you are affording me this opportunity which I really appreciate.

As a parole eligible inmate I can show the authorities that I try to use my time productively while incarcerated by showing my progress and grades in the MINTS program.

We get very little outside entertainment within the confines of these walls. Yet, once again your support allowed us to attend a performance of Reverend Coppolo's performance of The Gospel of Mark. His ability to memorize an entire gospel is amazing but the way he brings it to life is awe inspiring. Some will never read the Bible but for those blessed to be in the audience that evening this man brought this book of the Bible to life. His performance was so riveting that I felt I was back in the holy land in the time that Christ preached.

You may never realize the impact and life changing potential your support of this prison ministry has but I will tell you from personal experience YOU are changing lives and hearts and you are doing it for the King!

Thank you for your continued support of an element of society that many shun. The prisons are fertile grounds for developing soldiers for Christ and you are backing the right shepherd to tend this unruly flock.

It is hard to fully express my gratitude in words but thank you ever so much.
